Johanna Beier is a German opera and concert singer in the lyric soprano range and grew up near Esslingen am Neckar. Already during her studies, she was engaged as a guest at the Munich State Theater at Gärtnerplatz and will make her house debut in April 2024 as "Anna Reich" in the new production of "Die lustigen Weiber von Windsor" by Otto Nicolai, directed by Brigitte Fassbaender.

In the years 2021 & 2022, she was part of the summer productions of Kammeroper München in "Talestri" by M.A. Walpurgis and "The Marriage of Figaro" by W.A. Mozart. As part of this, she performed at Nymphenburg Palace, the Cuvilliés Theatre in Munich, and with guest performances in Germany, Austria, and Switzerland.
